STAYING INFORMED - THE NEWSLETTER

ATTENDANCE

Regular attendance at school is critical to ensuring that every student has the kind of opportunities in life that he or she deserves. When students are not at school, they are missing out on so much. Without the knowledge, the skills or the support that schools are so good at providing, young people can get left behind and find themselves underprepared for a fast-paced and often very challenging world.

Therefore this year it is crucial all students attend school and we continue to focus our efforts towards "Every Learner, Every Day".



USE OF STUDENT PHOTOGRAPHS

The school respects families wishes to use or not use photos of their children in publications that are either electronic or on paper. The permission to use photos continues from the previous year and will remain in place unless the family advises the school otherwise. If you do not wish the school to use your child's photo in any publication, please let the school know in writing.



ANAPHYLACTIC STUDENTS AWARENESS

Parents are reminded that some of our children can have a severe anaphylactic reaction to various food products. This reaction can be life threatening. Please support the school by not sending food in your child's lunchbox to school that may contain nuts, nut products or egg. This includes all peanut butter products and Nutella. Thank you for your co-operation in this matter.

SCHOOL FEES

School fee statements will be sent to your home address over the coming weeks. Please notify the school office on 47 262 200 if you have not received these by Friday 1st March, 2019. Flexible payment plans (FPP) will be offered to families again this year and this information will be enclosed with your school fee statement. If you wish to take up this payment option, you will need to post back the relevant documentation to the CEDP at Locked Bag 4 North Parramatta 1750. Please do not return this documentation to the school. Payment for instalment 1 2019 school fees are due Wednesday 20th March 2019.

AFTERNOON DISMISSAL REMINDER

The **safety** of our children is important as we establish routines within the school. It is important to every Staff member that they know where and with whom each child has gone in the afternoon. Please find below a reminder about Afternoon Dismissal which I ask everyone to become familiar with.

In the afternoon the following is to occur:

DRIVEWAY: All students in Year 3-6 who are being picked up by family members will need to be collected via the driveway. This can be accessed via the small gate next to the Office door which is opened at about 2:50pm.

<u>SAILS:</u> Students in Years 1 and 2 will line up in their class groups under the sails area. (Pavers area as you walk through the big gates) We ask that parents wait until their child has spotted them and told their teacher before taking them. This is so the teacher is aware of the child leaving and who they are traveling home with.

<u>KINDERGARTEN:</u> Students in Kindergarten will be dismissed via the gate near the Church. If they have older siblings then they will make their way to Kindergarten when the bell rings at 3:05pm.

<u>SIBLINGS:</u> The only **EXCEPTION** to the above routine, is if students in Years 3-6 have a sibling in Year 1 or Year 2, they will need to meet them under the sails where they will be collected.

EARLY BUS/BUS: Any students who travel home via bus will either line up at Early bus (along the windows outside the office) or in the Breezeway. The teacher will collect these students and walk them to the bus pick up zone.

<u>WALKERS:</u> Any students who walk home or need to walk across the crossing to meet family members for pick up will need to go to the walkers line. The teacher will then walk them safely to the crossing on Andromeda Drive. The teacher will also cross them over both driveways into the school if this is required.

In the event of Wet Weather or Sweat Weather, the gates will be opened at about 2:55pm. Parents are invited to walk down to the students learning spaces and collect the children from there.

At 3:25pm all students who have not been collected will be walked to the Office and a phone call home will be made to inform you of this.

We ask that parents respect the students and teachers and wait in the given afternoon pick up areas rather than walking down to the learning spaces or picking up their child from off the lines as they are making their way to these areas.

Transitioning Tips



Transitioning back into the new year after the holiday period, may cause feelings of anxiety especially for those who find change challenging.

The holidays may provide a reprieve from work or school, but after having weeks of no homework, no school or work hours and later bed-times, it can be difficult to adjust straight back into the usual routine.

> Here are some suggestions to ease back into the start of a new year.



Choices



Get back into a routine by

- · setting bed-times and wake-times
- · reducing screen time
- turning off devices an hour before sleep-time
- · reading books

Giving kids choices can help them feel they have some control

- · choosing their breakfast
- · what to eat for recess and lunch
- · helping pack their bags

Healthy eating choices are important to keep an active and healthy body

- · be aware they are eating a healthy breakfast
- · provide ample food for lunch to get them through the day



Talk to your children about their day and give them the opportunity to share any worries. Don't share your own anxieties. Listen to your child's concerns and validate their feelings to show them your are listening and know they can handle it.



Acknowledge the transition back to school may not always be smooth. Listen to any worries and make a plan for dealing with these challenges. Perhaps practice with your child by role playing. This may help your child feel more confident to a handle the situation if it arises.


