CYBER SAFETY

Children and young people may not deliberately seek out inappropriate content. They may inadvertently access content while undertaking online searches, they may seek it out, or be referred to it by others. Young people with smartphones might also be able to discover content that may be blocked by home and school internet filters. Offensive or illegal content may include topics, images or other information that are prohibited in Australia or could be damaging to young people online. Offensive or illegal content can expose children to concepts that they are not ready to manage and that may breach social and cultural norms. Some content can be distressing for children. They may not report it to parents or teachers as they may be ashamed of what they have seen, particularly if they sought it out.

What can parents do?

- Encourage your child to tell you about inappropriate content they have come across and make a complaint about specific content.
- Limit their exposure to inappropriate content by <u>supervising their online time</u> where possible.
- Install filters, labels and safe zones that enable you to reduce their risk of exposure to unsuitable or illegal sites

• Help your child use search engines to locate websites. Consider developing a list of favourites for younger children.



MEDICAL ALERT - CAMPYLOBACTER JEJUNI

We have been informed of a case of Campylobacter Jejuni a bacterial infection, symptoms usually occur 2 to 5 days after infection with the bacteria, but can range from 1 to 10 days. The most common clinical symptoms of Campylobacter infections include diarrhoea (frequently bloody), abdominal pain, fever, headache, nausea, and/or vomiting. Campylobacter can be contagious. Should your child experience any of these symptoms please see your doctor.
