Vinnies Return and Earn

The NSW State Government launched the Return and Earn Container Deposit Scheme (CDS) in late 2017 in an effort to address drink container litter, which makes up 44% of the volume of all litter in the state. Vinnies participation in the scheme expands on its ethos and ongoing commitment to recycling, and is an extension of their retail store philosophy of reuse – helping to divert waste from landfill and supporting those in need at the same time.

The program provides Vinnies with an additional revenue stream to help fund its Good Works within communities across NSW, receiving a handling fee for every container processed.

As part of our ongoing commitment to sustainability we will be supporting the return and earn scheme through Vinnies. Two bins will be established in our school for the collection of

containers. All proceeds will be going directly to Vinnies.

Oral Language at Corpus Christi

What's been happening for the staff members at CC?

On Monday the 24th of June 2019, the staff at Corpus Christi engaged in a Staff Development Day focusing on *Oral Language* across the different Key Learning Areas. The teachers were 'students' for the day, learning about the different strategies and ideas to implement in the classroom to build the oral language capacity of our students. We engaged in a professional reading around "Talk Moves" and used strategies for sharing the main idea such as *Concentric Circles*.

Oral Language looks like....."Drama Literacy Workshops"

Some of the teachers showcased the Drama Literacy workshops the Year 3 students have been doing: Postcards, Tableaux, Neutral and Mirroring. All of these drama skills link into writing ideas, vocabulary building, active listening and speaking clearly. Whilst some of the skills were challenging, staff participation was engaging and practical for the classroom.

Oral Language looks like....."Talk Moves"

Strategies of Adding On promotes speaking and active listening; Reasoning explains thoughts and ways of thinking; Repeating is active listening; Revoicing is checking what the speaker is saying and restating this; Turn and Talk shares ideas with a partner ; and Waiting is thinking or processing of ideas to problem solve. Talk Moves are being used in many Key Learning Areas across the school including English, Mathematics, Science and Religious Education.

So.....let's talk, listen, reason, popcorn and mirror our ideas everyone! Ask your children what this looks like, what they think, have a conversation, actively listen and see if students can explain their thinking!!!

Year 6 Project Based Learning (PBL)

Excursion to Taronga Zoo

On Wednesday 19th June, Year 6 went to Taronga Zoo for PBL to study about the Green and Golden Bell Frog - why it is endangered and how we can help its survival. There were many other endangered animals too, for e.g. Sumatran Tiger, Sumatran Rhino, Koalas etc. We learnt what was making these animals descend rapidly in numbers. There were many highlights of the day but my top 3 highlights were:



1. Koala Photos: There were a group of five that stand underneath the koala and the teachers took photos.
2. Habitat Classrooms: We went in an enclosed room and saw many birds, lizards and bilbies. We discovered how a scientist keeps track of the animal (how it behaves) on a chart. I went in the Desert Classroom whereas others went in the Woodland Classroom. I bet the Desert Classroom was better!
3. Free Time Around The Zoo: We saw many animals around the zoo my favourite would definitely have to be the tigers! Everything was great until the Bush Chickens AKA the Ibises stole some of our food!

I loved the day out we learnt so many valuable lessons, I know I will definitely use those lessons again! It was the best trip I've ever been on!
