## Mathematics at Corpus Christi <br> What's been happening in Year 3?

During this week, Year 3 have been conducting Chance experiments using hoola hoops and bean bags. Set at different distances, each child needed to predict, then throw 5 bean bags into a hoola hoop from varying distances, working out how many bean bags will go into the hoops.

Based on the syllabus, Chance and Data, students were predicting possibilities, conducting experiments, changing variables, collecting data, interpreting data, questioning and discussing outcomes from the chance experiments.

Here is a sequence of the experiments outside, in the sunshine, no rain, what are the chances?


Students are discussing their results from the chance experiments with a learning partner.


Students written responses about their chance experiments developing their mathematical language and reasoning.
