KISS AND DROP

Project Based Learning at Corpus Christi

Last Tuesday on the 5th March during Catholic Schools Week we had an Open Classroom session which was focused on our students sharing their learnings in Project Based Learning (PBL) for Geography. We had many family members from all grades who were able to attend and thoroughly enjoyed seeing, discussing and assisting our students with their learning. We asked our families to engage in providing feedback via the use of "Exit Tickets" and what they liked, were wondering and if they had any next steps for our students in regards to their PBL/ Geography unit.

For our families who may be wondering...

Project Based Learning is an engaging 21st century instructional method that has the potential to provide the deepest and most lasting impact on learning. Learning is student centred, occurs in small groups, it provides students with a sense of independence, fosters collaboration amongst peers and encourages real world problem solving. Students are presented with an authentic problem (in the form of a Driving Question) and are required to engage in a variety of research and problem-solving activities.

ATTENDANCE

It is so important that all children are at school every day.

Routines can help. These include:

- A nutritious **breakfast** fuel for the day.
- The right amount of **sleep-** to be alert and ready to learn.
- Organised the night before- bags packed and lunches organised creates a sense of calm each morning.

Make time to talk about school and check in regularly about what is happening for your child.

GOOD HABITS ARE FORMED EARLY

Just one or two days absent a month can add up to nearly four weeks of a school year. That's a whole year of lost learning from Kindergarten to Year 10.

Research indicates that attendance patterns are established as early as Year 1 and are likely to continue throughout a student's school career. Students who regularly attend school are also more likely to complete Year 12.

Early intervention strategies are key to ensuring that we can prevent absenteeism before it can put students at risk.

SCHOOL FEE STATEMENTS

School Fee Statements have been sent out to all families. Enclosed with your school fee statements will be information in regard to the Flexible Payment Plan (FPP). We encourage you to participate in this method of fee payment and to adhere to the payment dates/options. This payment method helps you with your yearly budget planning as it allows you to pay your fees in instalments over the 2019 year.
