

Should you choose, please consider helping your child set a target and fundraise for the poorest children in Ghana to have their basic needs met such as food, clean water, healthcare and education. Below are some examples, or please choose your own target:

\$37 can help to build new classrooms in a remote school, which will provide children with a safe learning environment.

\$164 can cover the cost of providing nutritious food for the 78 children at the Nazareth Home for God's Children for one day.

\$610 can cover the cost of vital medicine for one child at the Nazareth Home for God's Children for one year.

As part of our Crazy Sock Day we will be sharing in the experience of shooting goals with the soccer balls the Year 6 children made at their 'Focus on Mission' afternoon.

FRONT GATE SECURITY - SCHOOL HOURS

A reminder that if you are leaving the school grounds via the front gate during the school hours, you are asked to ensure that you do not let any late arriving children through the gate. Please direct them through the Front Office to be signed in.

All late arriving children need to be signed in by their parents or caregivers through the Front Office. This is a legal requirement and part of our Attendance procedures.

LEAVING STUDENTS

A term's notice (10 school weeks) in writing must be given to the Principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be payable. One exception, is that notice in writing will be accepted at any time during Term 4 in relation to the following year's enrolment, that is, the notice period of 10 school weeks will be waived in this circumstance.

Please advise the school as soon as possible, if your child will not be returning in 2020.

STUDENT BIRTHDAY CELEBRATIONS AND STUDENT BELONGINGS

Below is a request that we are asking of the parents regarding student birthday celebrations. Hopefully this will help you all.

If it is your child's birthday and they wish to bring in a food item to share with other students, we strongly encourage you to only send in small individual cupcakes. Sending in individual cakes will help make the distribution to students quicker and will eliminate the need to freeze ice blocks or refrigerate jelly cups.

Please also limit the number of items that are brought up to the school to be distributed to your child. Please encourage your child to remember to bring in all items to school that they require for the day. le homework, library books, lunches, drink bottles, hats, jumpers. 
CLASS AWARDS 2019

2020 School Travel Applications Now Open

To assist with any enquiries you may receive regarding student travel applications, we have provided some information below.

Applications for student travel in 2020 opened on Friday, 11 October 2019.

Students progressing to year 3 and year 7 no longer need to re-apply if they:

- are continuing at the same school
- are residing at the same address
- have *not* been sent an expiry notification from Transport for NSW.

Where a student meets the new distance eligibility, the system will automatically update their entitlement. If they do not meet the new eligibility, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

If students need to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ ssts/updateDetails

Applications need to be submitted before 31 December 2019 to ensure student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card is not cancelled. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2019, the system will automatically cancel an entitlement/card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2020.

Students residing in Rural and Regional (R&R) areas should receive their travel pass at the commencement of the new school year from their nominated operator, this may be distributed via the school or sent direct to their address. Note: some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students/Parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.
