#### Meaning of these symbols

Circle: has no beginning or end - represents God's life which is everlasting - his love for us has no end.

**Evergreen**: their ever-greenness reminds us of life, growth and hope.

Candles: Waiting for Jesus to come. Purple - time for preparation, time to recognise our need for Jesus. Pink – a sign of joy because we know that God loved us so much that he sent Jesus into the world.

Purple Ribbon : Ribbon - decoration on gifts - we should give other people some of the love of Jesus through our good deeds and kind words. Purple - represents hard work and that our giving to others will be hard work too.

Each week a candle will be lit (1≝ week Hope-light one purple candle, 2∞ week Faith- light two purple candles, 3<sup>∞</sup> week Joy-light the pink candle , 4<sup>∞</sup> week Peace- light the last purple candle).

#### **END OF YEAR AWARDS**

In addition, these students articulate a concern for the poorest of the poor, are actively involved in fundraising or show an awareness for people less fortunate than themselves.

**Communication and Co-operation** - students demonstrate this through the way they speak with each other, staff and visitors. They are often the first to volunteer to help, they are quiet leaders - although not always first. They encourage others to achieve their best.

**Effort and Persistence** - students demonstrate this through constantly "having a go". They rarely give up and try multiple ways to achieve their goal. They show the quality of being determined to do or achieve something and have firmness of purpose.

# THE ADVENT WREATH

The circle represents the eternity of God. The evergreen wreath represents life and immortality. There are 4 candles around the wreath – 1 for each of the 4 weeks of Advent. The white candle in the middle is lit on Christmas Day. The candles represent Jesus, the light of the world. The 3 purple candles represent prayer, penance and preparation. The rose or pink candle is lit on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Advent and represents joy.

We invite you to join us each week during Advent as we light a new candle in the lead up to Christmas Day
