PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents,

We continue to monitor the COVID- 19 situation and continue to follow all advice.

In response to advice avoiding large gatherings of staff and students:

- Staggered recess and lunch breaks across the school day. Children will be eating and playing as usual but not as a whole school group.
- Children will go directly to their learning spaces in the morning. We ask that you say goodbye to the children as quickly as possible.
- School gates will open at **3pm** for a staggered end to the school day. Please pick up your children from outside of their learning spaces each afternoon. As you approach, teachers will send the children to you.
- There will not be any whole school events or gatherings of more than 100 people in a closed space.
- All participation in major sporting events will not go ahead

In response to advice on personal hygiene, handwashing and infection control:

- Students will be reminded about hygiene measures to control the spread of germs such as coughing/ sneezing into elbows.
- Deliberate supervision and visual reminders for hand washing.
- Extra soap provisions in the toilets and classrooms.
- Hand sanitiser is available for all adults that sign in through the Administration area.
- Students will be permitted to use their own personal hand sanitiser from home if they choose.

If your child has a cough, aches, pains and a fever, they are not to attend school.

*If anyone in your household has the Coronavirus, your child must **NOT** attend school for a period of 14 days and then be cleared by a doctor. You **MUST** notify the school in this situation so the authorities can guide the school in its response.*

The health and well being of our community continues to be paramount and I thank you for your support.

Consequently, Corpus Christi Parish will implement the following plan:

Three outdoor weekend Masses which will be held on the school basket ball court at the back of the church:

- Saturday Vigil Mass– 6pm
- Sunday morning Masses– 7.30am and 9.30am
- Chairs will be not available so if you want to sit, please bring your own chair.
- Masses will be in a simple manner (without music) and will not exceed 40 minutes.

SCHOOL FEE STATEMENTS

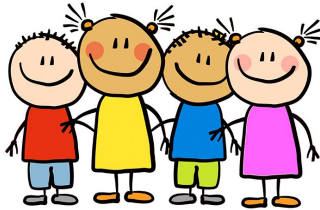
